RULES AND REGULATIONS:

1. This is not a sanctioned competition, but every class will be judged as nearly as possible in accordance with USEA rules. Show Management will determine variation from those rules.
2. Negative Coggins test dated 1 year or less prior to show date is required for all entries. Entries received without a negative Coggins will not be processed.
3. Entry forms must be completed in their entirety and signed by the rider or a legal guardian if under 18 years of age.
4. Entries received without payment will not be processed. Make checks payable to Ebony Horsewomen, Inc.
5. Entries postmarked prior to the opening date or after the closing date will not be accepted.
6. Refunds and/or changes are subject to a \$15 office fee. No refunds after the closing date without a signed veterinary/physician's certificate.
7. All returned checks will be charged a \$30.00 fee.
8. SEI approved helmets with harness fastened are required at all times while mounted for the 2-Phase competition and for all competitors under the age of 18.
9. Horses will remain in control and at the walk on the grounds outside the show rings or warm-up areas. No horses allowed in restricted areas.
10. There shall be no working of horses outside the designated show rings or warm-up areas.
11. For the safety of all, show management reserves the right to excuse any horse/rider for unwarranted misbehavior - including uncontrolled behavior - and/or unsoundness.
12. The show management reserves the right to cancel, combine, or divide divisions when deemed necessary.
13. Ribbons/Awards: 1st Place prizes and ribbons to 6th place will be awarded in each class.
20. Food & water will be available on site.

For all Classes and Divisions, competition age of the rider is based on their age as of May 1, 2018. This will allow riders to accumulate points for the entire show season in those classes and divisions.

Pets

All dogs must be on a leash, no longer than 6 feet and attached to a human. Owners of free-running or unattended dogs will receive a warning.

Stalls

Stalls are available for \$45. The fee does not include hay or shaving. Hay and shavings may be purchased through the Horse Show Office.

CLASS DESCRIPTIONS

Ribbons are award in all classes from 1st to 6th place. Metal awards and special awards given out by the families of the gentlemen memorialized.

JUNIOR PLEASURE FLAT: Classes are open to riders up to the age of 13 years. Riders will be judged at the natural gaits of the walk, trot, and canter, and may also be asked to extend the trot or to perform a hand gallop. Horses are judged on their manners, performance. This class is judged on the rail. Entry Fee \$25

WALK-TROT PLEASURE: Open to riders up to the age of 10 years. Horses/Ponies to Walk and Trot both directions of the ring. Judged on Manners, Performance, and suitability.

\$100 ADULT ENGLISH EQUITATION FLAT: To be shown at Walk, Trot, Canter. Entries may be asked to back and Halt. To be judged on manners performance and suitability. Martingales prohibited. To be ridden on a reasonably loose rein on command. Distribution- \$45, \$35, \$20

\$100 ADULT ENGLISH PLEASURE FLAT: To be shown at Walk, Trot, Canter. Entries may be asked to back and Halt. To be judged on manners performance and suitability. Martingales prohibited. To be ridden on a reasonably loose rein on command. Distribution- \$45, \$35, \$20

\$50 JUNIOR EQUITATION FLAT: Open to Junior Riders up to the age of 13 years. To be shown at Walk, Trot, Canter. Entries may be asked to back and Halt. To be judged on manners performance and suitability. Martingales prohibited. To be ridden on a reasonably loose rein on command.

WILBUR J. TALLEY ENGLISH PLEASURE: Open to horses and ponies, Juniors and Adults. To Walk, Trot, Canter. May be asked to back. Extended gaits may be requested. To be ridden on a reasonably loose rein on command. To be judged on manners, performance, and suitability.

HUNT SEAT LEAD LINE: Open to riders up to the age of 7 years. Entries may be asked to trot. Riders to be judged on elementary fundamentals of horsemanship. An adult is required to lead each entry.

WALK-TROT EQUITATION: Open to riders up to age 10 years. Riders will be asked to walk and trot in both directions of the ring. They will be judged on position, ability to control their steed and diagonals will be considered.

JOHN WARD MEMORIAL MEDAL ADULT EQUITATION

Open to adult amateur riders. Two or more tests of the top four competitors are required. The same horse must be used in all phases. Only one rider per horse. Three riders must complete the course in order for points to count.

PHIL CASHMAN MEMORIAL MEDAL JUNIORS

Open to Junior Riders up to the age of 13 years . Riders will be asked to Walk, Trot and Canter in both directions. Two or more tests of the top four competitors are required. The same horse must be used in all phases. Only one rider per horse. Three riders must complete the course in order for points to count.

WESTERN

JUNIOR AMATEUR WESTERN PLEASURE: Classes are opened to riders up to age of 13 years. Riders are judged on the rider's equitation at the walk, jog, and lope in both directions. Riders must sit to the jog and never post. Riders are judged on the rail, with a pattern, or a combination of both at the discretion of the Judge.

\$50 JUNIOR AMATEUR WESTERN PLEASURE STAKE – Classes are opened to riders up to age of 13 years. Riders are judged on the rider's equitation at the walk, jog, and lope in both directions. Riders must sit to the jog and never post. Riders are judged on the rail, with a pattern, or a combination of both at the discretion of the Judge. Stake distribution– \$30, \$20, \$25. Must have a minimum of three entries.

\$100 ADULT AMATEUR WESTERN EQUITATION: Classes are opened to riders over the age of 14 years. Riders are judged on the rider's equitation at the walk, jog, and lope in both directions. Riders must sit to the jog and never post. Riders are judged on the rail, with a pattern, or a combination of both at the discretion of the Judge. The performance of the horse is not judged *per se*, but a poorly performing horse is considered to reflect the ability of the rider. Stake distribution– \$45, \$35, \$20

\$75 ADULT AMATEUR WESTERN PLEASURE STAKE: Classes are opened to riders over the age of 14 years. Riders are judged on the rider's equitation at the walk, jog, and lope in both directions. Riders must sit to the jog and never post. Riders are judged on the rail, with a pattern, or a combination of both at the discretion of the Judge. The performance of the horse is not judged *per se*, but a poorly performing horse is considered to reflect the ability of the rider. There must be a minimum of three entries.

Riders are judged on manners and suitability of the horse for a relaxed but collected gait cadence and relatively slow speed of gait, along with calm and responsive disposition. This class is judged on the rail at the Walk, Trot and Lope. Riders may be asked to back up

JOHN WARD MEMORIAL METAL ADULT WESTERN PLEASURE: Classes are open to riders over the age of 14 years. Riders are judged on manners and suitability of the horse for a relaxed but collected gait cadence and relatively slow speed of gait, along with calm and responsive disposition. This class is judged on the rail at the Walk, Trot and Lope. Riders may be asked to back up

PHIL CASHMAN MEMORIAL METAL JUNIOR WESTERN PLEASURE: Classes are open to riders up to age 13 years. Riders are judged on manners and suitability of the horse for a relaxed but collected gait cadence and relatively slow speed of gait, along with calm and responsive disposition. This class is judged on the rail at the Walk, Trot and Lope. Riders will be asked to back up

Schooling Round Over Fences

Unjudged schooling rounds are for any rider who wishes to warm up over fences just prior to their class. One schooling round per entry, per ring is allowed. Show management reserves the right to limit the number of fences jumped in Unjudged Schooling Rounds. Judge must be informed of a

rider's intent to complete an unjudged schooling round **before** entering the ring. Failure to do so may result in entry being disqualified from the class for which the warm-up precedes.

*(definition of armature: Owned, trained or Shown) - Horses are not to have been professionally trained for a period of one year immediately prior to the competition (riding and driving instruction for the owner to be excluded). In addition, horses are not to be exhibited, prepared, groomed or schooled with the aid of or by a professional while on or off the competition grounds immediately before or during the competition.
